




"Ask an Expert" Consultations




HOTEL MAP

HARRY KRAEMER From Values to Action



Today's business environment demands values-based leaders who, in "doing the right thing," deliver outstanding and lasting results. But "if you are not self-reflective, how can you know yourself? If you do not know yourself, how can you lead yourself? If you cannot lead yourself, how can you lead others?" asks Harry Kraemer, Kellogg School professor and former chairman and CEO of Baxter International, Northwestern University. In this thought-provoking keynote, Kraemer identifies self-reflection as the first of four central principles that guide leaders to make choices that honor their values, and candidly recounts stories of how these principles helped him navigate some of the toughest challenges he faced in his career as a leader and teacher.

HARRY M. JANSEN KRAEMER JR. is the author of *From Values to Action: The Four Principles* of Values-Based Leadership and a professor of management and strategy at Northwestern University's Kellogg School of Management, where he has been voted the Kellogg School Professor of the Year. The former chairman and chief executive officer of Baxter International Inc., a multibilion-dollar global health care company. Kraemer is currently an executive partner

with Madison Dearborn Partners, one of the largest private equity firms in the United States.

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
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
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
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
